Each classroom teacher will provide students with specific information about their plan to assess and/or showcase learning for their course as well as possible makeup and study sessions. We view this week as an important part of the learning, assessing and reporting process and will expect students to attend all required sessions. **Please be reminded that all Provincial Assessments are mandatory for graduation.**


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Note: Students in semester courses will have double blocks on Monday - Thursday. A detailed schedule of teacher offerings and exams is posted on our website.

Day	Expectations for Students
Monday-Thursday	All students attend their regular classes when scheduled in the afternoon.
	Students are to attend Provincial Assessments when scheduled.

*Students who are writing exams need to remain in class for a minimum of one hour. Once students have left class, they may either leave campus for lunch after the morning session, or head home in the afternoon. If students choose to stay on campus, they may either stay in a classroom previously arranged with a teacher present or stay in the Grand Hall which will be supervised. Students are not to be in the hallways as this is a disruption to students in other classes.
