Financial Awards Guide

A STEP BY STEP GUIDE TO THE FINANCIAL AWARDS PROCESS

Click on the colored links for more information.

- 1) Visit the school website <http://css.sd33.bc.ca/> under the section Student & Parents/ Financial Award Information. Click the yellow headers which will take you to another page. Read. Check the list of Internals and Externals found under the section Financial Awards, noting the criteria for each.
- 2) Make sure you are checking your my *blue print* mail box and listening for announcements.
- 3) Copy and paste those awards that fit you into your own Word document. Check the list often as they change right up until the deadlines. Look at the top for the most current date.
- 4) Complete a *Reference Resume*. This is a resume for your References so that they know about all the things you're involved in. This is different than a job resume. Provide them with a reference resume.
- 5) Identify who your *references* will be. One in school (teacher, counselor, administrator, coach) and two out of school (employer, pastor, coach). Ask more than 2 people. Do this EARLY!! Get them to send it to electronically to you. See *letter example*.
- 6) The *Internal* and *External* standard form is found on the school's website. It is a writable form and you need to save it to your computer first. You can amend it many times and eventually will have a finished product ready to be submitted by the due date. Practice filling this out.

The *External Specifics* have their own form. Some Externals have specific document requirements so read each carefully in the List. There is a page in the application for you to copy and paste any additional essays that the donor requires.

Students must meet BC graduation requirements of either the 2004 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of their graduating year. Students can win only one District/Authority Award. The award is valued at \$1250.00.

- Technical and Trades Training** (e.g. Carpentry, Automotive, Welding, Mechanics, Cook Training)
- Indigenous Languages and Culture** (demonstrated at school or in the community)

SD33 Financial Awards

SD33 Financial Awards

Eligibility:

*Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded

*Be a B.C. resident

*Meet the selection criteria for each scholarship

*Students are eligible for the local award program at their school of record.

Internal Awards

These financial awards are decided upon by a group of teachers, counselors, and administrators at the school level. These financial awards are donated from groups/organizations in your community. These groups/organizations donate the funds. They do NOT want to decide who the student recipient is as they feel the staff knows the students the best. Winners will be kept confidential until the Award Ceremonies.

External Standard Awards (School Mails)

These financial awards are donated from groups/organizations in your community. THEY DECIDE which student is the award winner. Winners will be kept confidential until the Awards Ceremony.

External Specific Awards (School Mails)

The organization has a specific application form and THEY DECIDE which student is the award winner. Do not use the CSS Standard Application.
