Dear Applicant,

This program is for grade 10, 11, or 12 students and consists of 3 courses: **Equine Studies 10**, **Environmental Science 11**, and **Physical and Health Education 10 (or Active Living 11/12)**. We hope to provide students with the opportunity to:

- 1. Connect to our community's important agricultural roots, by gaining competence and confidence within the complex and rewarding relationship that exists between a rider and a working horse. This will be facilitated by skilled professionals from both the school and the barn.
- 2. Connect to the local environment, by doing applied environmental science fieldwork.
- 3. Get your PHE 10 credit by counting your horseback riding time, along with the other physical activities you are already doing in your week (dance, sports teams, hiking with your dog, etc.)
- 4. Provide students with the opportunity to earn between 12-14 credits towards graduation!

Students will also benefit from learning in an applied and decidedly low-tech and low-stress outdoor environment during class time. We encourage personal wellness, practice goal setting, gain exposure/experience to the equestrian sports, and reflect on our learning in meaningful ways. (We also spend time on campus at CSS, where students will have access to technology for various assignments.)

Note that **Equine Studies 10** is an *introductory to intermediate level course* that will allow students to gain (or further) their knowledge in all areas of horsemanship, in a personalized way, depending on their initial level when entering the course. Along with covering the basics of riding, students will further develop their skills under the instruction of professional horse trainers/coaches. Students will be expected to demonstrate correct safety procedures while working with and around horses at all times, while acquiring basic knowledge of the following units of study:

- Barn Safety, Horse Psychology (including horse safety), Horse Handling
- Horse Breeds, Colours, Markings, Anatomy, Grooming, Tack
- Horse Health, Care, and Nutrition
- Saddling, Bridling, Lunging, Mounting/Dismounting, Riding, Maintaining a detailed Riding Journal
- History of the Horse, Equine Disciplines (sports), Equine Trades (farrier/leather worker/etc.)
- Special Project Portfolio (equine-related topic of choice).

As an option, students may have the opportunity to achieve rider level certification in a Horse Council BC accredited program (such as EC Western Rider Levels or CHA Levels, depending on interest and availability of qualified evaluators.) EC Western Rider Level 1 certification can be counted as 2 graduation credits!

If you would enjoy learning about horses & environmental science, are motivated, and have a strong work ethic, then the CSS Equestrian Program is for you! As well, you must be an independent worker, and have passed all of your grade 9 courses.

In order to be considered for the Equestrian Program, you must complete and submit this application package by the end of course selection (dates will be posted on our website css.sd33.bc.ca/equestrian-program).

Important Notes: A program fee of \$200 applies, but it can be paid in installments throughout the school year. It covers our lesson fees, and busing costs. Each rider is also responsible for acquiring a Horse Council BC youth membership (approx.\$50), and needs to have a pair of boots, of any sort, with at least a ³/₄ inch heel (for safety in the stirrups.) *If cost is a concern/hardship, please don't let that prevent you from applying, we can help.*
