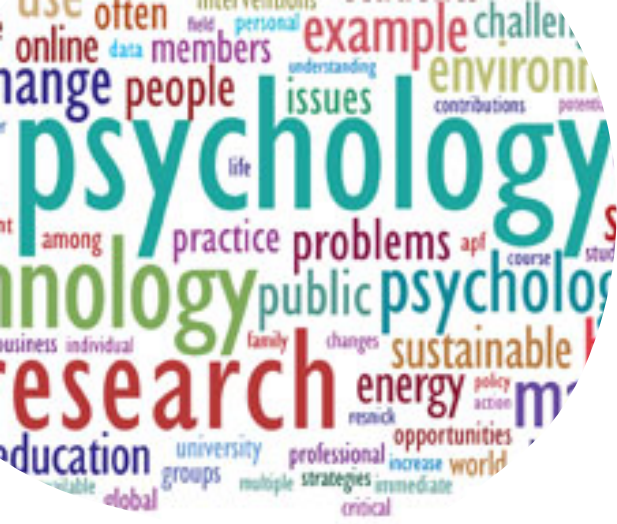

Program Details



Each year, students will complete their course work using an on timetable block within their schedules.

In addition, they will complete their training sessions and placement work (grades 11 & 12 only) during six to seven Saturday sessions, spread from September to June. This will give the students an additional four credits per year (a total of 12 additional credits over the three years).

Placement work consists of teaching our *Building Social and Emotional Resiliency* curriculum, written by Dr. Rob Lees exclusively for our program, to younger grades in our surrounding feeder schools.

Grade 12 placement work will also consist of teaching a grade 9 class the same curriculum. Grade 12's will also have an optional placement with Pivot Point.
